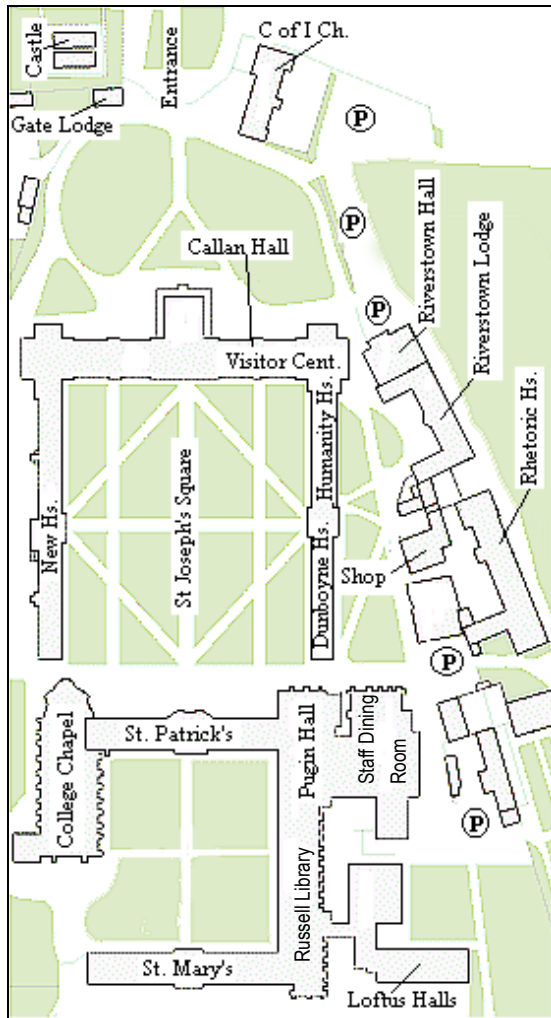


Map of South Campus
